Best wishes to everyone as we begin a new year and a new decade. No matter what the future will bring in the coming days, months, and years, you can be sure that Turning Points and Our Daily Bread will be here, tending to the demands of our neighbors in need in the community. We are so very grateful for the fabulous support our "snow birds" and long term volunteers lend to ensure our mission is implemented in an efficient yet compassionate way. It can be frustrating dealing with a population that often has members with mental health and/or behavioral problems that present barriers to providing services. Having people willing to take the time to listen and empathize with clients often enables them to gain the courage they need to step out and try new, more positive behaviors. So we salute our volunteers and encourage anyone interested in really making a difference in someone's life to come in for a tour to see if there isn't a position just right for you!

As many of you may have seen in the media recently, Turning Points is struggling with options for replacing our leaking roof. The One Stop Center was remodeled and opened in 2009, and 10 years seems to be around the normal life span of flat roofs. That has proven to be the case with ours, as microscopic holes have begun to develop due to the exposure to sun, wind, rain, hail and other environmental elements. Small holes tend to get larger, and some of these are causing noticeable leaks in our medical and dental areas especially. Watch for updates in the news soon!

In programming news, we are excited about piloting a new program "Manatee Adults Pathways to Success" (MAPS) to address the needs of people being discharged from the jail. Coordinating with law enforcement, probation, and Centerstone, we are developing a program that works to stabilize people re-entering the community as quickly as possible, providing an option other than returning to the environment and behaviors that caused their incarceration in the first place. Thanks to all who help support this and all our critically needed programs! As we look forward to each and every day, knowing you are there backing up our onsite services encourages and sustains our efforts. As we look forward to Spring which is just around the corner, let us consider that Spring can be a metaphor for change. Some Spring changes we eagerly look forward to, while other we loathe (pollen?). Some changes we plan and others arrive uninvited. May we all be blessed with divine perspective encouraging us to have expectations of hope and renewal as we move forward into this season of change.
